OVERVIEW

2022 was an exciting and productive year for MFM research, with several grant & training awards and a broad portfolio of publications in basic, translational, and clinical research. In addition, national and international collaborations with multiple national and international universities, the National Institutes of Health, and the Maternal Fetal Medicine Network Units have strengthened our research portfolio and impact. In addition to ongoing grant awards, there were new awards granted in 2022, and several grant proposals submitted for 2023.



Academic productivity was excellent, with 54 publications and 30 scientific & educational presentations at local and international meetings. Drs. Burns, Fay, and Stephenson-Famy have been at the national forefront in educational research and had a remarkable 7 oral presentations and will lead 2 break-out sessions at the 2022 Association of Professors in Gynecology and Obstetrics/Council on Resident Education in Obstetrics and Gynecology Annual Meeting Dr. Burns received the prestigious Best Oral Abstract Award at the CREOG & APGO Annual Meeting in Orlando, Florida.

The MFM division continued in cutting-edge COVID-19 related research, led by Dr. Kachikis, with 8 publications in high impact journals, with extensive coverage by national and regional media.

The MFM division continued its global presence, with several multinational collaborations resulting in several publications. Dr. Albright gave oral presentations at the 11th International Symposium on Marfan, Loeys-Dietz, and Related Conditions in Paris, and Dr. Shree and Dr. Albright gave oral presentations at the International Society for the Study of Hypertension in Pregnancy Annual Meeting in Montpellier, France.


A continued strength of MFM research is in its collaborative nature and breadth of research. Our current research portfolio at UWMC includes:

The renovation of the MFM Research Lab for processing and storage (RR 536 & RR540) continues to be upgraded. We have added a refrigerated centrifuge, have upgraded FreezerWorks, and now have a liquid nitrogen tank/freezer for storage.


